Mrs In the name of God Amen I Am Bishop of the parish of St. Ives
and County of Southampton being in health of body and of mind and
dispossession of all pain and memory thank God for the same
do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in form and
manner following I give and bequeath to my four sons James Bishop
John Bishop and Lawrence Bishop after my decease among
them to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever
Firstly I do bequeath my son James Bishop Executor of this my last
will and Testament for myself whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal this 15th day of February anno Domini 1819
Signed sealed published & declared as follows

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 1st day of January 1819
this will was presented in Court by James Bishop the testator thereupon
swore by the oath of a Justice of the Peace that the witnesses thereto are constituted
for further probate and for the motion of the said Executor who made
oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining probate
thereof in due form on his giving bond and security whereupon the said
James Bishop with Edward Nibbs and Jacob Barfus his securities entered
into and acknowledged their bond on the penalty of five hundred dollars
as constituted at the Law directs
