Being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this piece of writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following
I give to my friend John Harris my riding horse bridle and saddle to him and his heirs forever I give and bequeath to my cousin Sarah Cornwell four hundred dollars to her heirs her heirs forever I give and bequeath to my cousin Charles (Jr) Wailley Son of William Wailley all my lands and negroes together with the balance of my personal effects after the above legacies are full paid and it is my will that in my thing shall remain in the plantation as it now is without any sale to him and his heirs forever I do constitute and appoint my friend and uncle William Wailley the whole & sole Executor of this my last will and testament Witness my hand and seal this fourteenth day of March 1816

In the name of God Amen I William Francis of Southampton County and Parish of St. Pauls being in sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following first and principally I bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it me and for my ready goods I dispose of them as follows to wit I give and bequeath to my loving Sister Elizabeth & Francis the whole of my lands to be sold at public auction and the money arising therefrom to her and her heirs forever I give and bequeath to my loving Sister Sally Francis my two negroes Aveling & Moses to her and her heirs forever I give and bequeath the remainder of my property to be sold to pay my said debts and the balance arising from such sale to be equally divided between Samuel Francis Nathaniel Francis and Salathiel Francis to them and their heirs forever Lastly do constitute & appoint my friend Samuel Turner my whole sole Executor to this my last will and testament nothing was at other wills heretofore made by me and Witness my hand and seal this 24th day of January 1819
