In the name of God Amen I Thomas Westbrooke of the county of Southampton do make and ordain this my last will and testament in maner and form following that is to say 1st I give to my loving wife Nancy Westbrooke one feather bed & furniture one cow and calf one cow and piggs five Barrells corn to her and her heirs forever 2nd I give to my daughter Selby Westbrooke one Bed of furniture one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever 3rd I give my lands whereon I live containing by estimation one hundred and twenty five acres to my son John Westbrooke providing he pays my son Henry Westbrooke the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars in the space of ten years to him and his heirs forever 4th I give my son Henry Westbrooke one cow and calf and his hundred and fifty dollars to be paid him by my son John above mentioned to him and his heirs forever 5th I give my daughter Dorothy Westbrooke one Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever Last my will and desire is that all the rest of my property that I have not disposed of be sold at public sale by my Executors save also my just title be paid the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between my wife and three named children Selby John Henry and Dorothy Westbrooke to be paid and then their heirs forever lastly I do constitute and appoint my friends Melior Francis and Samuel Sumner my whole and exclusive Executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof my hand and seal this 2nd day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventeen
