At a Court held for the county of Southampton on the 17 May 1819 this will
together with the codicil thereto produced was this day presented on court by
Richard Stewart one of the Executors named in this will was sworn by
the oath of solemnity & of Waulson and ordered to be recorded and on the mor-
row of this said day was made oath according to Law Certificate is granted him
for obtaining a probate thereof in due form on his giving bond and security where-
upon the said Richard Stewart together with Asahel Waulson and James Mearns
his Executors entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of three
thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs

my perfect senses of hereby make and ordain this to be my last will and testamen-
to my friends and family following hereby reciting and depaupering all other and
former wills by me heretofore made I give and bequeath to Peter Faircloth
Muellet Waulson whom I emancipate one thousand dollars and a sufficient of heredito
to pursue for him a good English education to be paid by Executors and I desire and do
hereby declare it to be my intention that my negro woman called Mason should
not remain in Slavery longer than the lifetime of my friend Collin M. Barnes
to whom I hereby give her during his life at the death of my said friend Collin
M. Barnes I do hereby declare it to be my wish that she should enjoy her
freedom and I do accordingly bequeath upon her soul I give and bequeath
unto my friend James Wright my gig and harness chaise and riding horse
and I pray at Capt. Richard Waulson to this I give and bequeath unto
my friend Collin M. Barnes of the County of Southampton and State of North
Carolina all the balance of my Estate both real and personal and I appoint
executors or remainder to him and he has been forever & I appoint my friend
Collin M. Barnes the only Executor of this my last will and Testament I declare
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17 day of
March 1819 Signed Sealed published and declared by the testator to be his last
