Southampton being of a sound disposing mind and memory
do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following to wit

Improvis

It being the wish and desire of my wife Mary T. Marion that I
should bequeath to her all my household in the following negroes
which I had by her Vizt. Nell, Nat, Sarah, Felix and Furling
also 1 Bay mare and side saddle one feather, two and a half
also half chest and trunk all of which I had by her and if
my wife Mary Marion sole accept of the above property
in full satisfaction of her dower right in my Land and all
the rest of my property of every description in good condition
I do voluntarily give and bequeath the above property but in
case that she shall be dissatisfied with it after death and
refuse to accept of it in full of her dower right I then
bequeath the above property during her natural life or more
when and I also bequeath during her life or widowhood one
negro woman named Eacy I also bequeath one third part of my
Land which I now have with improvements thereon
