I declare that this will of my Estate both real and personal to divide between my wife Lucy Barnes and my son Simmons Barnes precisely as the same appears and would have been if I had not made this will but here has due witnesses to all intents and purposes but nevertheless if my son Simmons Barnes shall die without lawful issue of his own body then and in that case my wife and I am in my said wife Lucy Barnes may have all the right title and interest in and to the one third of all my personal Estate which she is entitled to agreeable to the foregoing provisions the same to be at the disposal of my said wife to any person or persons whomsoever and also to enjoy the benefit of all my lands for and during her own natural life the case of the death of my said son and he leaving no lawful issue of his own body as aforesaid I give all the residue of my Estate both real and personal equally to be divided between Mary Barden Conents Barden and Martha Barden to them and their heirs forever

I do hereby recommend and affirm my said wife Nancy Barnes the Co-Executor of this my will hereby revoking and annulling all other wills heretofore by me made in writing whatever I have heretofore subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 13th day of February 1821.
