

I, the named of God Amen, being of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory during the hours unto me on my marriage Contract, entered into between me and my husband Lewis Albertus (afterwards) of disposing of my estate either by deed or last will and testament in manner and form as I thought think fit to make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows.

I desire to be buried in the family burying ground of my brother Daniel Butts with the rest of my family.
Item, I desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate in the first place.
Item, I give unto my beloved brother Daniel Butts and that tract or parcel of land wherever I now live and which I bought of the heirs of Jacob Turner deceased also the following Negro slaves to wit Habirus, Henderson Venus and Charlotte to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my beloved niece John William wife of Richmond Dillard my riding Carriage and horses and the following Negro Slaves to wit Bridget Harriet Lavina Frederick and Bel and Mahan, picture of my late husband George Dillard to him and his heirs forever.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved Brother Daniel Butts and nephew Richmond Dillard executor to this my last will and testament, revoking all other wills heretofore made by me. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of September 1815.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 19th day November 1821
This Will was presented in Court by Daniel Butts one of the executors therein named, proved by the oaths of John Urquhart and Giles Summerville two of the Witnesses thereto, ^{and to the satisfaction of the Court} Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form, who made oath according to law. Whereupon the said Daniel Butts together with Henry Parker and John Urquhart his Securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars Conditions as the law directs.
