Then I give and bequeath all my Lands and the rest of my Estate to my Daughter Mildred Spivey and her husband to them and their heirs forever all but I keep one to take care of my wife as long as she lives with a plentiful support out of my Estate as long as she lives Then I do appoint William Spivey my wife and sole Executor to the my Last Will and Testament but my wife should have her share of my Land and Goods appraised my wife this 10th day of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one before me and delivered into the presence of us and delivered into
