

In the name of God amen I Samuel G Turner of Southampten County and Parish of Saint Peter being in sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my Last will and testament in manner and form following first and principally I bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it me and for my mostly good which I hope I dispose of them as follows

- Item 1 I give and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Turner the following property namely two negroes Ephraim and Jordan and three calico girdles also one brass three corners and calico of her choice for sons and twenty Egg fifteen hundred pounds worth fifty Barrels corn five stacks of blade fodder the whole of my kitchen and dairy furniture for spinning wheels all my sitting chairs one chest of drawers one pine chest three barrels one ladder shovels one pine table one bed and furniture one egg and harness six heads of sheep of her choice one pair new pair Sails all my slaps and harness all my guns and fowls five francs to said Father Two florin carpets shawl and things one tea bottle and brass bottle all my earthenware china ware and tea Beans one dressing glass with drawn spr flat vases two axes three working tools plus two one pair cart wheels and cart to her and her heirs forever
- Item 2 I send to my loving wife Elizabeth Turner my hundred plantation containing three hundred and sixty three acres also three negroes named Nancy Molly & Margaret during her natural life
- Item 3 I give and bequeath to my daughter in Law Rebecca Jane Williamson one Bed and furniture one mahogany table to her and her heirs forever but wish and direct that my wife should keep the same name property in her possession until the said Rebecca Jane Williamson marries or arrives to Lawfull age
- Item 4 I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Polly Turner one bed and furniture one mahogany table one mahogany Dresser the same to stand in my house as they are until she arrives of age or marries to her and her heirs forever
- Item 5 It is my will and desire that my two old negroes Tom and Bridget may remain on the Lot where the men are
- Item 6 I give and bequeath to John C Turner my part of the damm Land now in the possession of Elizabeth Turner upon the express provision If he makes himself satisfied with the Guinean amount to him and his heirs forever
- Item 7 Now it is my will that if my Daughter Polly C Turner departs this life under age of eighteen years old or without marriage that my estate be equally and in between the children of John C Turner and the whole of the children of Nancy Turner her daughter children included and also the children of Susan Parfitt who was formerly Susan Turner to them and their heirs forever Lastly I do nominate and appoint my friend Lawrence Cook & John Spruce my whole and sole executors to this my Last will and testament voiding all others before made Witness my hand and seal this 4th day of January 1782 signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of John E. Channing Nathaniel Newson

The Court held for the county of Southampten on the 15 March 1782 The following presented in Court by John Spruce and Lawrence Cook the executors herein named proposed by the oaths of John C Turner and Nathaniel Newson the witnesses thereto and ordered that the records and on the motion of said John Spruce and Lawrence Cook the executors on oath granted them for obtaining a precept thereon in due form on the giving bond and security with the said John Spruce and Lawrence Cook together with Henry Peter John C Turner & John Edwards Shumbrake entered into and acknowledged a Bond on the penalty of money
