age of twenty one years to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Tops one negro woman named Lucy and her children
excepting Ben before given away and negro woman Rachel and her children to her and her husband
I also send my daughter Nancy Tops one tract of land that I purchased of the Masters of Honey Bugg
deed Containing two hundred acres unto my Grandson Richard Bennett above named from the date
land shall go to him

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Arington Stephenson one feather bed and Furniture to him and
his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Amos Stephenson the whole of my Estate of every description and value
given away to him and his heirs forever my desire is that my son Amos Stephenson shall support
my son Arington Stephenson during his life I do appoint my son Amos Stephenson my sole
sole Executor to this my last will and testament On witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 17th day of November 1819
