Price Nathaniel Price and Nathan Price executors and legatees of Elizabeth Price decd. of one part and Benjamin Cobb administrator of the said Elizabeth Price decd. of the other part to settle adjust and finally determine all matters in difference between the parties in relation to the administration of the said Elizabeth Price decd. And Whereas for the putting an end to the said differences and disputes that the said Vice B. Price and Nathan Price and Benjamin Cobb by their several bonds or obligations bearing date the day of 1819 are reciprocally bound each to the other in the several sum of to stand to and abide the final determination of an Arbitration between John S. Puffer and Benjamin Cobb arbitrators mutually chosen between the said parties have this day taken the matters and things in difference between the said parties under our Consideration and having had due deliberation thereon (the testimony of the parties having been submitted to us) do award and determine as follows That the said Benjamin Cobb administrator of the said Elizabeth Price decd. pay to the said Vice B. Price and Nathan Price their proportion of the Estate of the said Elizabeth Price decd. amounting to the sum of one thousand and eighty six dollars for each of the several accounts it will appear fully) without delay from December 31st 1819 till paid. Given under our hand and seal this twenty first day of February Eighteen hundred and twenty

Item I give to my brother Arthur Williamson all the lands that I own in from the estate of my deceased father John Williamson in consideration that he does pay to my brother Benjamin Williamson seven hundred and fifty dollars when he takes possession of said land but if my brother Arthur Williamson refuses to pay the seven hundred and fifty dollars to my brother Benjamin Williamson then my Will and desire is that the said land shall go to my brother Benjamin Williamson

Item I give to my brother Benjamin Williamson all the balance of my estate of all times whatsoever to him and his heirs forever signed sealed and published of

The Court ordered that the said will be recorded and on the motion of the said Benjamin Williamson the same is granted him as his young heirs and assigns. Whereupon the said Benjamin Williamson together with George S. Puffer Arthur Williamson and William Williamson his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of
