A Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17th December 1822. This will was presented in Court by Benjamin Barrett the executor therein named proved by the oaths of Benjamin Barrett and Eliza Carter, his and her oaths were taken and sworn to be true, and on the motion of the said executor made, with according to law, outpicks were granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form, giving security for the said Benjamin Barrett together with Eliza Carter and James West his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars, conditioned as the Law directs

With undersigned arbitrators mutually chosen by Vice P. Price Nathaniel Price and Nathan Price executors and legatees of Elizabeth Price dec'd of one part and Benjamin Cobb administrator of the said Benjamin Price dec'd of the other part to settle adjust and finally determine all matters in difference between the parties in relation to the administration of the said Robert Price on the estate of the said Elizabeth Price dec'd and thereof for the putting an end to the said differences and disputes that the said Vice P. Price and Nathan Price and Benjamin Cobb by their several bonds or obligations being date the day of 1819 are respectively bound each to the other in the special sum of ten thousand dollars and above the final determination of said Benjamin Cobb John Saffers and Benjamin Cobb arbitrators indifferently chosen between the said parties have this day taken the matters in dispute in difference between the said parties under our consideration and having had our deliberations therein (the testimony of the parties having been taken and taken as) do award and determine as follows That the said Benjamin Cobb do pay to the said Vice P. Price and Nathan Price their proportion of the estate of the said Elizabeth Price dec'd amounting to the sum of one thousand and eighty six dollars for each by reference to the annexed account which appears fully without dissent from December 31 1819 till paid. Given under our hand and seal this twenty first day of February eighteen hundred and twenty

A Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21 February 1820 This arbitration award was read and the said Benjamin Cobb together with the said Benjamin Cobb on the 15 May 1820 This award was ordered to be recorded

Thomas Williamson

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Williamson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being in the last moments of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament, to wit

I give to my brother Arthur Williamson all the lands that I have from the estate of my deceased father John Williamson on condition that he do pay to my brother Benjamin Williamson seven hundred and fifty dollars when he take possession of said land but if my brother Arthur Williamson refuses to pay the seven hundred and fifty dollars my brother Benjamin Williamson then my will and desire is that the said land shall go to my brother Benjamin Williamson

I give to my brother Benjamin Williamson all the balance of my estate of all things whatsoever to him and his heirs forever signed sealed and published in presence of

Thomas Williamson

A Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20 January 1823 This will was presented in Court by Benjamin Williamson who took upon himself the execution thereof no one being mentioned in the will proved by the oaths of John McLeary and Sallston Williams on law of the witnesses thereof ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Benjamin Williamson for letters of administration the same is granted him on his giving bond and security, whereupon the said Benjamin Williamson together with George Ingham Williamson and Sallston Williams entered their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs
