Joseph Gray In the name of God amen I Joseph Gray being of a sound mind and disposing memory do make & ordain
this to be my last will & Testament in manner and form as follows. I do
Item 1st I give my lands to my two sons Edward and Joseph Gray to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided between
them so that piece which I have bought of James Gray may also be in one lot which said I give to my son
Edward Gray and the part wherein James resides I give to my son Joseph Gray
Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my two daughters Sally and Eliza Gray the balance of my lands both land and water
I further my will and desire further is that my daughters Sally and Eliza may if they think proper live on my
plantation during their natural life or so long as they remain alive and have the government of a good
Cotton field & if they think proper half way until a house is built on the plantation & it shall appear to my
executors to be necessary my will is for them to have one half of my life and descent as further that a crop shall be
planted on my plantation as long as they the present time my daughter Sally and Eliza Gray to be found a
supporter of it for the ensuing year & to support out of the produce of my plantation as long as they live Eliza
Gray to live on it my life and descent is that my sons shall be sent to school two years and to board
with my daughter Sally & to be educated & brought up to my trade & service and Joseph Gray and my daughter Sally
Gray and Eliza I give up all my property to them & my sons in this my last will & Testament
First & last my attorney at law wills testifie In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
