I do solemn State of Southampton County do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following by  
First I give my Grandson Joseph Stiles forty acres of Land to be laid off to the north side of the old Bladensburg Turnpike from  
Sandys I give unto my daughter Rebecca Stiles the sum of five dollars  
Third I give unto my Grandson Jacob Stiles the sum of Ten dollars  
Fourth I give unto my Daughter Ruthie Stiles the sum of Ten dollars  
Fifth I give unto my Son John Davis all the rest of my lands and all and sundry property of every kind whatsoever not heretofore given away out of which he is to pay all just debts to him and his heirs  
Sixth I do hereby constitute my son John Davis my only Executor to this my last Will & Testament  
Witness all this and Testimony before me made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October 1822  
Whence John Davis

This Court held for the County of Southampton on the 17 May 1823 This Will was presented in Court  
by John Davis who by his perjury the Father of the Executrix therof made States the Testator  
named Edward Tracy by refusing to qualify himself by the oaths of John Davis Solomon Phelps and Matthew  
Sperry the witnesses thereto and ordered to be tried and on the motion of John Davis who was  
such according to Law certified as granted him for obtaining a probate hereof his deposition on his  
giving God and Country before the said John Davis together with Amos Williams and  
William Tracy his Securis testified and acknowledged their hand in the penalty of  
Five hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs

Will Turner  
On the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1823

Will Turner in his death bed regretteth that after his just debts and funeral expenses  
of his Estate that Heleld Bal more than threethousand five hundred dollars of his said Estate after the said Five  
hundred dollars to his son Nathan the balance of his personal and real Estate to his beloved Sister Sally  
Turner after said Sally Turners death if she dies without marriage to go to Benjamin Turners children aforesaid  
of former Turners and Nathaniel Jones

This Court held for the County of Southampton on the January 1823 This non capacie testate of Samuel  
Turner was presented in Court and proved and established as the last Will and Oreded to be recorded and  
on the motion of J. Benjamin Turner for letters of administration on said Estate the same is granted him  
and young sons and Security whereupon the said Benjamin Turner together with Son to Turner and  
Henry Parker his securities entered into and acknowledged their hand as the Penalty of Ten thousand  
dollars conditioned as the Law directs

Will I Elizabeth Collier of the County of Southampton do hereby make my last Will and testament in manner & form  
following that is to say first I desire that my whole Estate slaves and other personal estate may be sold by my  
executor hereafter named and that he pay out of the money arising therefrom all my just debts of general or special  
debtly After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses my son ahd the remainder of the sales of my  
Estate together with such debts as may be due me except what may be due me from my daughter Anna A. Collier  
which I do hereby discharge her from the payment of provided the sum may not be augmented  
for the payment of my debts among the residue into three equal parts to be distributed in the following  
manner viz I give one part to my daughter Anna Collier on part to my daughter Olivia A. Collier  
and the remaining one third part to my son as my desire may remain in the hands of my executor hereafter named  
to be by him applied in such manner and in such proportion from time to time as he may think proper  
to the support of my son Thomas R. Collier and my Grandson Benjamin R. Collier son of Thomas R.  
Collier shall arrive to the age of twenty one years at which time it is my desire he may have whatever may  
be remaining of the said one third part of my estate in the Times of my executors and Lascely I do hereby  
constitute and appoint my friend Henry Hagg Executor of this my last will and testament hereby above  
thigall other and former wills or testament by me hitherto made excepting that I have now and then offered my last  
an day of the year 1821 so as stated published and made publick will and testament of this day named Elizabeth  
Collier Chrs. A. 1821 as I certify
