In the name of God Amen I John Carr of Southampton County State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory and willing to mind the certainty of this and let last to make this my last will & testament in the following manner and first I desire that my lawful debts be paid out of my Estate. I then bequeath my beloved wife Sally Carr all my present estate until I have one child shall arrive to the age of twenty one years and if my said wife should marry and of the marriage I desire that she take her lawful dower of my personal estate but in case my said wife lives a widow until I have a child twenty years old I then desire that an equal division of my personal estate be made of my said personal estate be made among my wife and children at the discretion of any executor or executor appointed by them to make the division and my land I leave to my wife Sally Carr until my youngest child shall be twenty one years old except the mares and if the mares I leave her her lawful dower of my lands but if she lives my widow until my said youngest child arrives at twenty one years old I will that an equal division according to Law be made of my land between my wife and children then living and lawfully I appoint my beloved wife Sally Carr and my friend Richard Sander Executor and Executor to this my last will & testament. At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st July 1823 This Will was presented in Court by Richard Sander the executor therein named Sally Carr the co-executor therein named refusing to qualify provided by the oath of Charles Edmunds one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Edmunds made oath according to Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof on due form on his giving bond and security whereupon the said Richard Sander together with a competent Jurat Worrell and John Spencer his securities entered into and acknowledge their bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars Conditioned as the Law directs
