In the name of God Amen I John Carr of Southampton County State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory and willing to mend the uncertainty of this my last will & Testament in the following manner and first I do hereby cancel all before paid out of my Estate. I then had my beloved wife Sally care of my personal estate until I have one child shall arrive to the age of twenty one years in life my said wife should marry and if she marries I desire that the like her lawful donee of my personal estate but in case my said wife dies a widow until there a child to forty one years old then I desire that an equal division of my personal estate be made of my said personal Estate he made among my wife and Children at the direction of any executors or persons appointed by them to make the division and my land I tend to my wife Sally Carr until my daughter Child shall be twenty one years old and if she marries I leave her her lawful donee of my lands but if she dies my widow until my said youngest child arrives at twenty one years old I will that an equal division according to Law be made of my lands between my wife and children then living and lastly I appoint my beloved wife Sally Carr and my friend Richard D. At Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st July 1823 This will was presented in Court by Richard Darden the executor thereon named Sally Carr the co-executor theron named referring to quality provided by the will of Carter Edmunds one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recited and on the motion of the said Executrix made out according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate whereupon due form of his bond and security whereupon the said Richard Darden together with a confidantable Sam'l Morell and John Spencer his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of six thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs
