thus. I give to my mother Mary Donald 73 Lbs my negro man Hyatt who is now in the
employment of Gregory Blakiston of Brunswick County to her and her heirs forever lastly I give
Samuel Blunt executor of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have
presented to set my hand and affixed my seal this 23rd day of May in the year 1823
