I James H. Miller of Southampton County Virginia do make and ordain this last Will and Testament in manner
and form following:

First I bind to my loving wife Temperance Humpson who the plantation wherein I now live being on the South side of the
road leading from Jones' Ferry to the Sandy ridge road then straight across the Sandy road to the dividing line
between Jones' Ferry and myself then along the said dividing line an easterly course to the dividing line between
the land belonging to the Estate of Dr. J. P. Miller deceased and myself then along the last mentioned dividing line
to a bottomy river sharp the said river to an oak standing on the South side of the road leading from Jones' Ferry
to the Sandy ridge road near the river bank where my plantation as I have understood formerly had a gate
and which is also a tree between the land that my wife for her gave her by a deed of gift and this
that I now bind her together with all my plantations above its my home hold and kitchen furniture
given and during the term of her natural life

Item I also bind to my wife during her natural life Anne nee in town Mary Abel Moore Abel and
Mary Sharpe woman son woman old Gray boy Luther and girl Letitia Sophia and Barbara

Item I also bind to my wife during her life one hundred acres of my lands less and cetera that may have or
have at my death and them of her choice also in houses her choice of those I may leave in hand at my death

Item I give and bequeath to my wife Temperance Humpson County five barrels of Corn out of the crop that
may be or have at my death or out of the crop that may be raised on the plantation after my death should there
at a season of the year that will make it necessary to keep the house together to leave a Crop division share of the
money that may be in the house at my death and one third of the notes and accounts that may have or
hand at my death to her and at her own disposal

Item I desire will and direct that my riding carriage which is now at Benjamin Brister should be
furnished off agreeable to Contract and that a suitable set of harness be provided which said carriage
and harness I give to my wife Temperance Humpson at her convenience

Item On the death of my wife I give in equal number I acre each the land that I have left her during her life
the boundaries of which may be or seen in the first claim of this will to my two sons James
R. Humpson and Edward Humpson to them and their heirs and assigns forever each third
womans only that James R. Humpson is to have that part only which I now leave in together
with the buildings where I now live and the orchard and the land to be divided in the said
James R. Humpson and Edward Humpson may think proper or best so that Edward is not
deprived of that part or portion of the land which he has already improved

Item I give to my daughter Fanny Gardner five dollars cash to her and her heirs forever
I give to my son William Humpson all the land that I now possess with being on the
west side of the road leading from Jones' Ferry to the Sandy ridge road and then straight
across the Sandy ridge road along the line of that herein to and to my wife and goods to
James R. and Edward Humpson to the dividing line between James R. and Edward Humpson
along the said dividing line a west course to Sheldell Warrens line thence along said Warrens line
a west course to Leonard Cobbs line thence along Leonard Cobbs line a N. E. course to the
dividing line of the lands belonging to the Estate of Nathan Hartford and my wife
then along the said dividing line an east course to the place of sever that my wife gave
her by a deed of gift then along said land an east course to the road leading from
Jones' Ferry to the Sandy ridge road then along the various courses of said road to the
Sandy ridge road then west the Sandy ridge road to the dividing line above
mentioned between the

Sept 2d 1823 given her heirs and assigns forever
