In the Name of God Amen I Laura Bishop of the County of Southampton State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such estate which I have given God to keep with & I do therefore make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say first I do hereby give my Executor to sell all my property and after paying my just debts and funeral expenses to give to my wife Martha Bishop one third of the money arising from the sale during her natural life 2nd after her death than to my Son John Henry of the sum he shall be dead without an heir then to my brother Henry Bishop 3rd I give to my son John D Bishop the remaining two thirds of the money arising from the sale of my property and if he the said John Henry my son should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years I give to my wife Martha J Bishop the legacy which I have given him the said John Henry to have use during his widowhood and on the event of my wife & John Henry dying without an heir I give my brother Henry Bishop all the money or debt which I have left him and lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend Esq. R. of this my last Will and Testament being writing at this office written on October 20th 1823 to witness my signature seal and declare as and for the last will and testament of the above named Laura Bishop superintended.

Specially I give Mary Bishop 3000⁰⁰ dollars

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th October 1823 This will was presented in Court, proved by the oaths of Geraly Scott and Henry Bishop his executors thereon and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Wm. Wimble for letters of administration with the will annexed (there being no Executor named in said will notwithstanding a year was left) the same is granted him on his giving bond security whereupon the said Wm. Wimble together with Joseph Murdough and Henry S. Magat his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond on the sum of six hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs

In the name of God Amen this 24th day of June eighteen hundred and eighteen I James Blunt of Southampton County, being in my perfect senses thank be to God for the same and knowing that he is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form following first I give to my wife to live and give her one and my body to be decently buried by my executors and trustees whatever goods good I have and bequeath them as in manner and form following

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Pete to her and her heirs forever my four wheel carriage which she now has in possession also my bed and furniture

Also I give unto my son Richard Blunt my feather bed and furniture which he now has in possession to my executors along my farm plantation to him and his heirs forever

Also I give unto my son Benjamin Blunt to him and his heirs forever all the remaining part of my Dogs Horses Cattle and Sheep also all the remaining part of my home hold and kitchen furniture together with my bed, also my Corp of Cow pasture and pastures and all of my property of every description not before recited as my belonging to the plantation wherein I now live excepting my Corp of Laundry and Cotton

Also I give and bequeath to my son Richard Blunt to him and his heirs forever all of the money bonds, & account that were in hand and left at my disposal by my deceased husband

Also By this and devise that all my property belonging to my flat ground plantation may be set together with my Corp of Laundry and Cotton along my home plantation and the money arising therefrom together the sale thereof with what money I may have in hand at my death after paying my just debts may be equally divided between my daughter Ann Pete, my son Richard and Benjamin Blunt and my Grand Daughter Louisa K. Blunt and her heirs forever. I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Richard Blunt of King's Blunt Executor to see my last Will and Testament the day and year first above written signed sealed published and declared in presence of
