I William Barclay of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make and ordain this present of writing to be my last will and Testament inasmuch and form following

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Barclay the land and plantations whereon I now live with the following slaves to wit: Mrs. James Bar and his wife Minna Shomon the Frank Sarah and her three children Fanny Turkey Harriet and her future increase William Charles Robt. J. Charles Gracey Wiley and others also eight beds and furniture her choice and all balance of her live and Chinese kitchen furniture four horses her choice fifteen hounds cattle her choice out of the stock at home twenty sheep her choice four thousand pounds of Tobacco as before in the possession of Lady Jennings to the hundred pounds of Tobacco for the year two hundred barrels of indigo corn for the year or proportionate shares one hundred and fifty con barrels such as there is each at Wm. Apple Mills and fifteen four day on plough and harrow being my choice two fiddle boxes ten bowls two four counters five narrow axes and one broad saw ten wedding rings four ghabbling hats two pair raw wigs one barrel punch brandy two barrels apple brandy one hundred pounds brown sugar fifty pounds white sugar and fifty pounds coffee the pounds to be her and her heirs forever

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Thomas D. Barclay my young plants here called and known by the name of Thomas Quarter all my slaves both young and old male and female except those already devised to his mother my wife (and to my son John except) with stock of all kind on said plantation with the plantation tools of every description to him and his heirs forever

Item 3rd It is my will that my son should be free and if the honorable Court of Southampton should judge it expedient that it is my further will that my Executors hereafter to be named should give him one hundred dollars and if the said Court should refuse to emancipate him that then and in that case my Executors give him one hundred dollars and oblige to go to any State that he pleases that will receive him

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Anne my Harlebury plantation to have and her heirs forever

Item 5th I give my down as well as my title that my wife should not devise to my wife from the plantation whereon I now live and her heirs forever

Item 6th I do constitute my wife Elizabeth Barclay my coheir and sole executrix of this my last Testament and security to be executed by the Court for her administration without my bond and seal. This 1822 signed sealed and acknowledged in the presence of

It is a Court here for the County of Southampton on the 17 November 1823 This will was presented in Court proved by the oaths of Thomas D. Barclay Joseph Hancock John D. Siman three of the witnesses thereto and was read Elizabeth Barclay the executrix thereunto refusing to take upon herself the burden of the execution thereof and in the presence of Walter Grady Esquire is granted here with the will above for obtaining a prelat thereof in due form on his giving bond and security whereupon the said Walter Grady together with Thomas D. Barclay and John Hancock of Thomas D. Barclay has security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the presence of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs. And also a Court held for the County of Southampton on the day of March 1826 Thomas D. Barclay came in Court and made application for letters of administration of the estate of the said deceased and the same is granted him on his giving bond and security whereupon the said Thomas D. Barclay together with his Executors of Thomas D. Barclay has security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the presence of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs
