

Richard Willmott
Will and Testament

In the name of God amen I Richard Willmott of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Planter being very sick but in perfect mind and memory to the best of my knowledge and judgment and publishing this my last Will and Testament by my selfe and desirous that my Executor hereinafter named shall be fully appoynted as having due & full power for the purpose of paying my just debts at his discretion

I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Willmott one third part of my land during her natural life to be left apart to her sole and absolute possession during her life. Also and unto her one third part of my personal estate during her natural life such as may be sufficient paying my just debts

Item. My Will and desire is that the other remaining two thirds of my Estate both real and personal be kept together in my land for the purpose of educating and maintaining my three children between Richard Willmott and Richard Willmott and my daughter Rosanna Willmott who arrives at the age of twenty one years or marries, at which time my Will and desire is that the whole of my property both real and personal then in the hands of my Executor be equally divided between the three before mentioned children or such of them as may be living at that time. Should Rosanna die before she arrives at the age of twenty one years or marries then my wish is that the property be still kept together for the use and benefit of the other two children until David arrives at the age of twenty one then to be equally divided between David and Richard. Should the wife of my between Richard and Richard die leaving no lawful issue of their body then and in that case I give the whole of my property both real and personal to William H. Penn and his children to him and his heirs forever including that which I have lost by my wife during my life and until that which I have given my children

Item. My will and desire is that the property which I have left to my wife both real and personal at her death be equally divided between my three surviving children and should there be neither of them living at her death nor neither of them have left an issue of their body then I give it to Rosanna. Known as before directed. My Will and desire is that should my Executor hereinafter named demand most proper at my time to pay out my negro and rent out my land for the purpose before mentioned that he be fully authorized by his direction to do And my will is that he exercise his own discretion in helping them together - hiring & renting out my property & that of any negro and servant and Committee Contracts that he be at liberty to sell and dispose of them at his discretion. I testify I do nominate and appoint my friend Colton H. Penn and his son Richard Executor to this my last Will and Testament writing all other words by me before made and dictating this to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have countersigned my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of October in the year of our Lord 1828.

No Court held for the County of Southampton on the 15th January 1824 This Will was presented on Court by Colton H. Penn and the Executor herein named proved by the oaths George P. Edmunds John Hopkins and John Penn the witness thereto and sworn to be read and in the manner of the said Present to be made out according to Law and such a grantee to be recorded him notwithstanding a protest being made in due form giving security whereupon the said Colton H. Penn and his son Richard H. Penn and Clements Hobolt his son step son to Colton H. Penn agreed their hands in the penalty of Six thousand dollars conditioned at the law courts

I do give my beloved wife Susanna Penn for my executrix either during my life or until her death to beuring her natural life or otherwise and she shall enjoy my self one bed and furniture such as she thinks proper to put on it the residue of my effects of all kinds during my life and since her death should be sold and after my just dues and funeral expenses are paid the money arising therefrom shall be used to defray the cost of interring my daughter Rosanna Payne Penn
