This power I give to my son James Thomas and fifty dollars in money and my will and desire is
that he shall make his half of it for the benefit of my two Daughters viz. Elizabeth, Nancy, Maria and
Charlotte and my will and desire is further that my son James shall take possession of the portion of
my property which will fall to these four daughters by Elizabeth, Nancy and Maria and Charlotte from
the sale of the land and let them have it as he thinks best. My will and desire is further that
all the remainder of my property of any kind be sold and one half the proceeds I give to my son
James and the other half to be equally divided between my two Daughters Elizabeth and
Nancy and my Daughter Maria. By Will and desire is last I name Elizabeth and
William Hill my Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I
Jack C. Foster do set my hand and seal this 20th day of April in the year of our
Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty three

The Court held in the County of Southampton on the 15th July 1824. This Will was presented in Court by Francis,
Williamson and William Hill the executors thereto named, proved by the oaths of John Knott and Dixon Taylor
and two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and in the motion of the said Executors
who made oath according to law Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in so far as
on their giving bond and security sufficient the said Francis Williamson and William Hill
together with James Taylor and Dixon Ferguson has securities entered into and acknowledged before
the Probate Court of Southampton and doth direct as the same aforesaid

In the name of God Amen I Edwin Turner of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being
this twentieth day of April eighteen hundred and twenty four of sound mind and memory do make and ordain
this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following
I give and bequeath unto my son John Arthur Turner all the land I hold in this tract or tracts wherein I
now live to him and his heirs forever
I give and bequeath unto my son John A. Turner my short Gains still negro boy Pompey and best mare
and her increase to him and his heirs forever
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Lewis Turner the negroes names Lewis and
Maffie as well as their increase to her and her heirs forever
I give and bequeath unto my two Daughters Children mainly John A. Turner and Nancy
Turner the balance of my Slaves not being both names to be equally divided between them without
being sold to them and their heirs forever
I leave the tract of land I bought (called Boys) tract to be sold by my representatives also the balance of my estate
and before names to be sold to pay my just debts then pay over to my Daughter Nancy L. Turner the sum of
five hundred dollars the balance of any to be equally divided between them as aforesaid my hand
and seal the date above written

The Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st June 1834. This Will was presented in Court proved by the
oaths of Henry Miller and Eliza Williamson the subscribers thereto and ordered to be recorded. The said leaving no children
Stephen Rockwell applied for letters of administration with the will annexed the same is granted him as his
young Son and Security witness for the said Samuel Rockwell together with a residence at his home
Eaton, Petersburg and Alexander E. Foster his priorities entered into due acknowledgement before
him in the presence of many thousands dollars conditioned as the same desirous
