That is to say to be divided and paid out each child share as to be paid by my Executor when he or she may arrive to twenty years old say Peggy Anne is one the eldest that is being as soon as she may arrive to be twenty years old then my will is for my intention to pay to her her part of my Estate after that my Executor must keep the balance of my Estate and pay it out so fast as the children may become to be twenty years old and no farther but should either of the above named children die before he or she shall be twenty years old then my will is for their to be an equal division of my property amongst the rest that might be living. I hereby nominate and appoint my friend Richard my Executor to this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills by me made and by these presents acknowledge this my last will and testament this 12th day of April 1824 signed and sealed by me the testator in presence of

The Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st June 1824 The Will was presented in Court by Richard Sardon the Executor therein named proved by the oath of Amos Stephenson one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executor the same was read according to Law Court, reads is granted him for damages a probat thereof on due form on his giving bond and security to be approved by the said Richard Sardon together with Lawrence a Clerk and Justices The Executors entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of twenty four hundred pounds Condition as the Law directs

In the name of God amen I Arthur Poythor being in sound mind and disposing memory do make and Ordain this my last will and testament in the manner and form following as followeth (viz) I give to my nephew James Poythor son of Edward the whole of my tract of land and also one negro man named Isaac and my Grey Horn and my bed and furniture I give to my niece Elizabeth Poythor one negro man named Annie and her accoutrements after this will also one trunk to her and her heirs forever.

I give to my nephew Frederick Poythor (the son of Edward) one negro boy named Charles to him & to his heirs forever. I do appoint my friend Richard Sardon my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament I do hereby constitute and establish this to be my last will and Testament revoking all other wills by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 8th day of February 1826
