In the name of God Amen I Horatio Scarborough of the County of Southampton being in a tender
of health but in my perfect senses do make this my last will and testament in the following manner
and form

- Item 1st I do promise I lend unto my beloved wife Sarah Scarborough during her natural life or widowhood
the following negroes to wit Pamel, Sir, Ruth, Ery and Harriett together with all my household and
kitchen furniture and plantation utensils also my crop of every description that I may have on hand
or growing on my plantation at the time of my death also such furniture and deas in chests as shall be laid
on for the use of my family also the whole of my stock of all kinds. I also lend unto my wife Sarah Scarborough
during her natural life or widowhood all my lands with the appurtenances therunto belonging on the north side
of the road estimated at one hundred and fifty acres the same more or less. The property above lent to my wife
during her natural life or widowhood I desire may be considered in lieu of dower
- Item 2nd I desire that what ever money lands or accout to I may have on hand after my just debts are paid be given
to my beloved wife as a fee simple to her and her heirs forever
- Item 3rd At the death or marriage of my wife Sarah Scarborough I give the lands which I have before lent to
my wife during her natural life or widowhood unto my son William Scarborough together with my lands on
the south side of the road supposed to be two hundred and fifty five acres the same more or less to him
and his heirs forever
- Item 4th I lend to my Grand daughter Temperance Ramsay during her natural life the following negroes to wit
Mabel, Mandy and Patsy together with their increase
- Item 5th I desire my Grand daughter Temperance Ramsay should die having no lawful heir of her own body
my desire is that the negroes Mabel, Patsy and Mandy with their increase may be divided to be
equally divided between my five children
- Item 6th I lend unto my Daughter Mary Ramsay during her natural life the following negroes to wit
Amy, Violet and Betsy with their increase provided the said Mary Ramsay should die having
no lawful heir of her own body my desire is that the said negroes be by Amy, Violet &
Betsy and their increase returns and be equally divided between my five children Eliza, William
Scarborough, Fanny Holt and Priscilla Barnes to them and their heirs forever
- Item 7th I desire that the balance of my negroes not before set aside may be divided into two equal parts
one of which I give unto my son Eliza Scarborough to him and his heirs forever and the other fifth part I
give unto my son William Scarborough to him and his heirs forever the other three parts to my
Daughter Fanny Holt, Priscilla Barnes and Mary Ramsay I lend to them & give to their heirs forever
- Item 8th The foregoing five legacies just above mentioned I wish to be settled and equally divided by my friends
William Francis Davis, Andrew Benjamin Turner and James Jackson
- Item 9th My desire is that the negroes Samuel, Sir, Ruth, Ery and Harriett which I have before lent
unto my wife during her natural life or widowhood may at her death or marriage be equally divided
between my five children Eliza and William Scarborough, Fanny Holt, Priscilla Barnes and Mary
Ramsay in the same manner and way as I have in the clause immediately above this divided
the negroes before this set aside to be divided
- Item 10th I desire that the personal estate which I have before lent unto my wife Sarah Scarborough during
her natural life or widowhood may at her death or marriage be sold and the money equally divided
between my five children ^{children} to them and their heirs forever
- Item 11th Lastly I do hereby constitute my son Wm. Eliza and William Scarborough Executors to
this my last will and testament revoking all others heretofore by me made
