

without a lawful begotten heir the plantation which I have bequeathed unto him are to be equally divided between my two daughters Elizabeth and Sally Harrison

- Item Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Harrison one negro man named Ben one hundred dollars and furniture for her and her heirs forever
- Item Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Harrison the sum of Two hundred dollars and one feather bed and furniture for her and her heirs forever
- Item Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Sister in Law Sally Lane the sum of fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever
- Item Seventhly it is my will and desire is that my Sister in Law Sally Lane and my two daughters Elizabeth and Sally Harrison shall have the liberty of being under the hands of what I bequeathed unto my Son Eleazer Harrison until they marry or choose some other home and as Compensation to him I give and bequeath unto him the stock of all kinds that I have and disposed of except one bay Horse which at my decease the said Horse and the other negro man Fanny to remain on the plantation which I have given my two children for the benefit of him and my two daughters Elizabeth and Sally Harrison I also give unto my Son Eleazer Harrison my farm my utensils also the balance of my lands held and kitchen furniture which I have not disposed of to him and his heirs forever
- Item Eightly it is my will and desire is that the money the hands and what is due to me after my just debts are paid and the legacies above mentioned are discharged the balance are to be equally divided between my two daughters Elizabeth and Sally Harrison and my Son Eleazer Harrison as also appoint my duty friend Benjamin Thuermer and my son Rowell Harrison Executors to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 6th day of October 1824 signed sealed and delivered in presence of

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th November 1824 The last will and Testament of Thomas Harrison decd was proved by the oaths of Harriet Harris and Abraham & Thomas two of the subscribers thereto and ordered to be recorded and as the motion of Rowell Harrison one of the Executors therein named who made such acknowledgment to have and on together with Benjamin Thuermer and Thomas Moore his decessors executor with an attorney before a line in the party of two thousand dollars and claimed as the law directs Certificate is granted the said Rowell Harrison for obtaining a probate thereof in due form

In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Robbells of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound and perfect mind and memory sheweth to his and calling to mind the necessity of this his last will and Testament of October 1824 made and ordains that my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first It is my will that all my just debts and personal charges be paid out of my estate secondly It is my will and desire if there is not enough of my personal estate to pay my debts and legacies that I shall hereafter give away for my heirs to be sold by my Executors to raise the money Thirdly I give and bequeath unto John Harrison fifty Dollars to him and his heirs and assigns forever Fourthly I give and bequeath unto Jesse Garrison fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Rebecca my wife the sum and over of my estate of every kind and nature not before given away to her and her heirs and assigns forever Lastly I nominate and appoint my worthy friends Robert Williams and Frederick Robbells Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby making do other will by me hereafter made In witness whereof I the said Benjamin Robbells have set my last will and Testament set my hand and seal this day stated as aforesaid
