Aa Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th December 1824. The Will was presented in Court proved by the oath of John Williams one of the witnesses thereto and ~~and~~ to be received. On the motion of Spratley for letters of administration with the Will annexed (the will leaving no Testaments) the Court is granted for delivery probat thereof in due form on his giving bond and security whereupon the said Spratley Williams together with John Simmons Edmund and John Hammond his Executors entered into and as their bays their bond in the penalty of Ten thousand pounds conditioned as the Law directs. And at a Court held at Southampton the 11th day of June 1825 the said will was proved and the Court is granted the probate thereof. Test. James Rochelle Clk
