The same is granted for allowing probate thereof in due form and his giving bonds and security whereupon the said Spratt Williams together with Peter Simmons Robbins and John Simmons his secretary entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs. And at a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st January 1825 and the aforesaid ~~John~~ ^{Pfeiffer} and ~~John~~ ^{Pfeiffer} Compton also acknowledged Teste. *John Pfeiffer*
