I Joseph Hart of the County of Surberien and State of Virginia being of sound mind memory and understanding do hereby make and constitute this writing to be my last will and testament in manner following

1<sup>st</sup> Following hereby appointing all former wills or testaments by me made void

2<sup>nd</sup> I desire that all my just debts be paid and I bequeath unto my loving wife Severa Hart during my life the sole use of all my Estate both real and personal of whatever nature or kind at my decease

3<sup>rd</sup> At my wife's death or marriage I give the whole of my Estate to my three children viz To James Hart to Joseph Hart and to Mary Hart to be equally divided between them I provide same to them and their heirs forever

4<sup>th</sup> I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Severa Hart my executrix and sole Executor to this my last will and testament. We Witness my hand and seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of August 1824 Signed Sealed and att<sup>d</sup> in presence of

At a Court held for the County of Surberien on the 27<sup>th</sup> December 1824 This will was presented & examined by the Executive Officers named refusing to qualify as such proved by the oath of John P. St. Asaph and John S. Saddle two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of James Harting for a commission with the wife annul the same is granted him for obtaining a probate of his will on his own bond and security whereupon the said James Harting together with Mr. Wallace and John Holloman his Secunders entered into and affixed a Bond in the full penalty of fifteen hundred dollars and so forth as the Law directs

2<sup>nd</sup> My will and desire is that at the death or marriage of my wife Frances that the above named property be equally divided between my three daughters viz Mary Ann Morgan and Priscilla Stone to them and their heirs forever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord 1824 Signed Sealed and att<sup>d</sup> in presence of
