 bidder and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between my two young and lawfully begotten  
 namely Elizabeth Sumner Ann Eliza Sumner Thomas Sumner Sally Sumner Nathaniel Sumner & Nathan  
 Sumner

Item I Give and bequeath unto my dear wife Micaiah Sumner all my household furniture on her and herself in her own jointure  
 that my wife's Table which he has now in his possession to her and her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Sumner one Red and furniture on her and herself in her own jointure  
 Item one chest on four Tables which he has now in his possession to her and her heirs forever  
 And the balance of my perishable property I will and desire to be sold and all my just debts paid  
 out of the money arising from such sale and the surplus of money if any to be paid equally  
 divided between my two young and lawfully begotten children before named and my further will and desire is for my  
 just and lawfully begotten children and eight acres be sold to the highest bidder and the money  
 arising from the sale of the land to be paid to my Executors hands and for him to purchase  
 with said money a suitable piece of land for my wife and children to live on  
 Lastly I do constitute and appoint my friends John S. Sumner my Executor to this my last will  
 making one the form as well hereafter made by me In testimony whereof I have hereunto set

 fees paying my just debts the whole of the content I have in my father's Estate that  
 was in the hands of his Executor to be equally divided between them after Peggy Sumner  
 paying in to Micaiah Sumners forty Dollars to them and their heirs forever

Item I Give unto my beloved Micaiah Sumners and Peggy Sumners a house which  
 I had against Henry Child for one hundred and fifty Dollars and also one set  
 against John Mott for the same then he has died release the equity of said set
