

of Thomas Munn's administration in Benjamin Munn's estate by the vouchers he furnished me by the accountants which appeared by the hand the balance due the estate the 2^d of December 1771 should be ten thousand and eight dollars 2s of principal and four hundred and seventy dollars 6^{cts} of interest making in the whole ten thousand and four hundred and seventy seven dollars 11^{cts} as shew above which said balance I have decreed to the request of the said Munn between the Deceased to wit To Elizabeth Munn 1/2 as her proportion which amounts to the sum of five thousand and four hundred and thirty nine dollars 5^{cts} To Thomas Munn estate executor as his proportion which amounts to five thousand and four hundred and thirty nine dollars 5^{cts} To David Wright as his proportion which amounts to five thousand and four hundred and thirty nine dollars 5^{cts} To Henry Munn as his proportion which amounts to five thousand and four hundred and thirty nine dollars 5^{cts} To Samuel Champerlin the right of his wife formerly Elizabeth Munn; which said several sums amounts to the above said balance of Ten thousand four hundred and seventy seven dollars 11^{cts} for all which is respectively shew due to the Court Commisfioners in 30 terms at 75^{cts} of 1000^{cts} paid by the Executors to wit

I give and bequeath unto my friend John Nicholas of Chipping the balance of my estate of every description real personal or otherwise to him and his heirs forever

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint the said John Nicholas my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament as Witness my hand and Seal the 2^d day of June 1780

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 18th July 1780 This still was presented in Court by John Nichols the Executor therein named proved by the oaths of Drury Waller Jacob Williams and William Pope three of the witnesses there and agreed to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executor was made such according to Law certificate as granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form on the foregoing bond Secured by John Nicholas the said John Nicholas with Thomas King and Robert Spring notaries entered into a act a Bond on the penalty of fifty thousand dollars and shewed as the Law directs
