Also request my Brother Benjamin Willmanson to permit my above named named sister to live with him or his family as long as they shall live single without paying any taxes & other and yearly fees yearly accounts and appoint my Brother Benjamin Willmanson my Executor to the my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 7 day of August 1825. In the name of God amen I Joseph Vick of the County of Southampton parish of Stoney and State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make & give to my wife Anna this paper witness to be my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit
I bind unto my beloved wife Anna Vick all my lands lying on the east side of the road leading from Pennick's to Smithfield together with all my personal estate of every kind whatsoever all my just debts are paid until my son Joseph Vick arrives to the age of twenty one years nipp she shall marry a man to be made up the same before that time then or either can speak her to his first to her third and she shall live my widow until my son Joseph shall arrive to the age of twenty one years then my will is that he shall receive one fifth part of my personal estate which may then remain unto his proportion around for his legacy in my personal estate my wife and daughter also is that my first wife be relieved out of this property tenth to my wife and daughter together with the pence below to be distributed among them and then the remainder to be divided among my children. Also I give my wife my son Joseph Vick all my lands lying on the east side of the road leading from Pennick's to Smithfield and to be divided out for the purpose of supporting the house and land and the balance of my to go to the use of my son Joseph and his children until my son Joseph shall arrive to the age of twenty one years and has a lawful time after that time and to my son Joseph Vick after the death of his mother all my lands lying on the west side of the road leading from Pennick's to Smithfield except that part called and known by the name of Adams Indians of Rocklands together with the one fifth part of my personal estate so left over mentioned the personal estate to be received at his arrival to twenty one years and the lands at the death of his mother to him and his heirs forever but I wish to see to it now to that time or term my will is that all the property given to him descend to his four children of whom and if any of them as may be living to them there being four to be equally divided between them
