

Pardon I, William Scarborough of Southampton County and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say 1st I give my negro man by name Peter to his wife and out of the proceeds of such sale any burial expenses and all my just and legal debt to be paid and discharged so it is sufficient to discharge them there it is my desire that enough of my personal property shall be left to discharge them as aforesaid 2^d I give to my wife Elizabeth of Scarborough the following property to wit all the lands, Estates negroes and personal property I give to my wife as also all my interest in the possession of Sally Scarborough both lands negroes and personal property during her natural life 3rd at the death of my wife I give and bequeath to my son Howell of Scarborough the following property to wit the plantation now in my possession of which I do sacrifice also one negro man by name Jeffrey and equal division of all the personal estate that may be considered legally mine at the death of my wife 4th at the death of my wife Margaret by I give and bequeath to my son James P. Scarborough the following property to wit the lands in which Sally Scarborough now lies the mines and bounds as they now are also one negro by name Anthony and one equal share of the personal property that may be considered my Estate at my wife's death 5th at the death of my wife Margaret I leave one hundred & bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Anne & P. Scarborough the following property to wit one negro woman by name Simpy one horse by name Lourca also one sugar yard Jimmy with their increase and an equal share of the personal property Considered legally my Estate at my wife's death also all my interest in the Estate now in the possession of Sally Scarborough 6th and lastly I constitute & appoint my wife Margaret P. Scarborough Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills and testaments I may have heretofore made Testimony whereof I have written to my hand and seal this 5th day of October in the year of our Lord 1825

And on the motion of the said Executrix who made oath according to law certificated & granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in due form on her giving bond security before the said Margaret Scarborough together with Gray Barker & Charles Morrison & Lewis Day her securities in his name of Jacks their bond in the sum of fifteen thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs

John Ferguson

At a Court held for the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia Testimony was spoken by the said Ferguson on the 15th day of October 1825 at the testation of the said Ferguson and witness therin named found by the oaths of William P. Smith and Thomas Moore two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to bear testimony that the following is an will that the said Ferguson desired his hand to start with the exception of Jack to mortgage no documents until his youngest son Elizabt be married to a age of forty one years and that his wife Rebecca Ferguson enjoy all the profits of such land & slaves as aforesaid during the minority of his said son Elizabt provided she keepeth his young all his family if they see cause to remain with her until such time as his said son Elizabt shall come to the age of thirty one years he also gave to his said wife four horses and five head of cattle for a time undetermined he further said that his negro man slave Jack after paying him the amount due to himself from his negro Jack his Jack to his wife and see the subscribers hereunto certify that the foregoing expression were all that were made to the best of our recollection by the above named John Ferguson at the time first and for the purpose aforesaid given under our hands this 15th day of October 1825.
