Item 1st I give to my beloved wife Sarah Jones the tract of land I bought of James Stanton in name of full containing one hundred & fifty acres and conveyed by deed to me executed by Samuel East and Elizabeth P. Jones his wife and James Stanton and Ann Stanton his wife to her & her heirs and assigns forever also I give her all my personal estate after the payment of my just debt my negro man Asa also Garrison Bettelah and Louisa until they come to full age

Item 2^d I do constitute & appoint my beloved wife Sarah Jones Executrix to this my last will & Testament reserving all other goods under my hand & seal the 9th day of September 1825

James Wright Esq In the name of God amen I James Wright of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of sound mind and memory but feeling that I like other men must die and desirous in the support of these articles of property with which I have pleasure to intrust me to make and Ordain this my last will & Testament

I doth all my debts paid and charge my wife's Estate for that purpose

It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Martha Wright shall have all my land on the North side of the main street leading to Bellfield and the small field opposite the gate on the South side of the road during her life or widow hood. I also desire that she may keep in possession for the same term and under the conditions hereafter prescribed all my negro slaves except the ones left Sandy and such other as she may designate who are to be hired out annually and their hire applied to the support and education of my children I also my will know that my wife shall board and educate my daughters and my son until in about ten years of age free of charge out of the proceeds of said property

If my wife should marry I give her during her life one third part of the said property that is the land aforesaid and all my negroes and at her death shall stand part
