

of land as to be sold and the proceeds of such sale and the negroes sold thereunto to be equally divided amongst my Children at the time of such settlement I wish the remaining two thirds of the said land to be sold and the amount of sales with charges two thirds of the said sales to be kept and divided equally amongst my Children as they respectively come of age or marry.
If my wife should not marry before any or all of my Children attain full age or marry then I desire that as they attain full age or marry they shall respectively take each a child part of two thirds of the negroes.
I give and bequeath to my wife such stock of all kinds as are the discretion of my Executors and also named shall be sufficient for her use and that of the family.
I will sell the residue of my lands to be or such terms and in such manner as shall seem best to my Executors and the proceeds of such sale I desire to my son William Edwards Knight as a fund for his Education and I desire that he may be Educated at one of the best Universities of our Country and brought up to such of the learned professions as he on consultation with the advice of his Guardians may suggest.
I nominate and appoint my loving wife and my friend Lewis Thorpe and John J.
