Beza Blunt I Benjamin Blunt of Glos if Southampton County do hereby make my last will and testament in manner  
and form following that is to say

First I desire that all my just debts shalbe paid.

Secondly I have given to my son John Blunt his full portion of my lands and slaves which he has in  
his possession. I also give to my said son my old negro woman Fink and her serveman  
Anthony to him and his heirs forever.

Thirdly I have given to my son Benjamin Edwards Blunt his full portion of my lands, slaves &  
my feather bed and furniture. Also give to my slave Lou my old negro woman Sarah  
his choice of my beds and the rest of my sewing apparel to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly I have given to my daughter Elizabeth Riddle her full portion of my slaves also my feather  
bed and furniture all of which she has in possession to her and her heirs forever.

Fifthly My trusty and faithful old servant Anthony I give him his liberty as a free man also one hundred  
dollars a year also the aforesaid rufus part of my sewing apparel and I do hereby appoint  
my son Benjamin E Blunt his trustee to receive the money from my Executors hereafter named  
and pay it to my said servant for his benefit and support.

Sixthly The rest and residue of my slaves I give to be equally divided between my three daughters namely  
Mary R. Blunt Sally Blunt and Lucy Edmunds also one feather bed and furniture  
to each to them and their heirs forever.

Seventhly I give to George R Edmunds my best riding Saddle and Bridle.

Eighthly I give to my son John Blunt my tract of land containing his hundred and twenty acres  
which has the church attached to it called the flat denomy church to him and his heirs forever.

Ninthly The rest and residue of my lands except the tract wherein I now live I do give to be sold  
by my Executor hereafter named and to be divided in the following manner five hundred  
dollars I give to my daughter Lucy Edmunds for her own benefit and to my daughter  
Elizabeth Riddle I give four hundred dollars for her own benefit and the balance of  
the sale of my Estate after my just debts are paid together with my outstanding debts I give  
to be equally divided between my three daughters namely Mary R Blunt Sally Blunt  
and Lucy Edmunds to them and their heirs forever.

Tenthly The tract of land wherein I now live containing seven hundred acres I leave to my three  
daughters Mary R. Blunt and Sally Blunt as a home and place of residence and to be kept  
until their death or marriage thus I give the said tract of land to my son Benjamin E  
Blunt to him and his heirs forever.

My Servant Anthony is to remain on my plantation when he may die during life and I  
leave him under the care of George R Edmunds instead of my son Benjamin Blunt  
And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Peter Weston & George  
R Edmunds executors of this my last will & testament hereby making all devise & grants  
wills or testaments by me before made and I request my executors not to be affraid  
and the Court of Southampton is requested not to chuse my executors to give security for  
the settlement of my Estate In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my  
seal this 18 day of December in the year of our Lord 1825
