 George Edward Frederick and daughter Sally Stephenson and the land which I have
 in the Arkansas Territory I have here mentioned before my Will is that if it can be
 sold for the money to be equally divided between my sons James George Edward Frederick
 daughter Sally Stephenson to them and their heirs forever. With I do declare and appoint my
 son Edward Stephenson Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
 signed this 1st day of Feb. 1823.
