all the balance of my Estate to William Egner and his wife to be equally divided 5<sup>th</sup> I appoint  
my Brother in law William Egner my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament  
I give under my hand this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May 1826

John J. Rogers his partner did sue Jack a land in the penalty of \$10000 Considered as  
the sum aforesaid.
