my executrix & what time it may be to be sold in a credit of five months and whatever amount that
might be found due to my estate after all just claims being paid off I then give all the balance of
my whole estate to my son William T. Spry but I want the said child William T. Spry to be
sent to school and give him a tolerable good education after that I want him to be sent to
some trade and if any money shall be left after he hath said William T. Spry is done going
to school my wish is and my will is for him to have it I hereby name, name, out of hand
my friend Richard Wardour my executor to this my last will & testament receiving all from debts
by the made and as by these presents acknowledge this my last will and testament the 21st
day of February 1828 signed sealed &

in Court proved by the oaths of Bridget Spry and Richard Spry two of the witnesses thereto & ordered
to be read Richard Wardour the executor therein named refusing to take upon himself the burden of the
execution thereof And in the motion of Thomas Spry who made oath according to Law Certificate
is granted him for all any protest of debt with the costs answered on his getting paid & bound
whereupon the said Thomas Spry son with Alexander (Myself) the Secretary entered into &
ackd a bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds as then conditioned as the Law directs

a white speck on her face also I give unto my wife her large Shroud one Speller one cutting also I give unto my
wife four Shirts one Scarf her one pair of garters and one more also I give unto my wife sewing all the
linen bits and button fasteners having her underwood But if she should get married again it is my wish
and desire that she should be shrouded as the Law directs also I give unto my wife one plough & ploughing
gear her wedding dress & bedding her and all the lands that I am possessed with in the same way that
I have above named also I give unto my wife all the Corn & Gravel

That my wife and desire that if my wife should get married again that she should be shrouded
as I have above named and my land under and And the residue of my property sold for the maintenance
of my five children I have one negro Girl (Maticia) one Cow & half Lamb one Turkey with half
seven Shirts four large One & 2 small One on white Scarf & garters one Speller one cutting one pair of
linen one half of a cow sent to be sold to pay my just debts I do hereby certify and approved & signed
Thyself my Executor to this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my Seal this 21st day of April 1823
