Sprey but I want the said child William T. Sprey to be sent to School and give him a tolerable good education after that I want him to be sent to some Trade and if any money shall be left after he has the said William T. Sprey is now going to School my wish is and my will is for him to have it I hereby name next and of second my friend Richard Wardour my executor to then my last will & testament according all former acts by me made and as by these presents shall appear then my last will and testament the 21st day of February 1628 signed sealed &

A Court held for the County of Southampton on the 21st August 1628 This will was presented in Court proved by the oaths of Orralley Inps and Nicks brother two of the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded Richard Wardour the executor named referring to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof And in the motion of Thomas Sturson who made oath according to Law certificate is granted him for all any protest of Debt with the will answered on his going out & Security notwithstanding the said Thomas Sturson with Alexander Mysscock the Security entered into & ack^d a bond in the penalty of five hundred shillings as then and there as is therein directed

I William Will of the County of Southampton do make and ordain that my last will & testament in manner and form as follows here by First I give and bequeath to my wife one negro woman & child name & name of Whittier also I give unto my wife her choice of a Cow and Pleading also one Trepper with a white spotted horse also I give unto my wife her large shears one Speller one cutting also I give unto my wife four shillings one ready bar one pair of pins one more also I give unto my wife sewing all the linen bits and button threads remaining her wardrobe But if she should get married again it is my will and desire that she should be provided as the Law directs also I give unto my wife one plough & ploughing gear one working horse & Smebling her and all the lands that I am possessed with in the same way that I have above named also I give unto my wife all the Corn & Grasse

It is my will and desire that if my wife should get married again that she should be provided as I have above named and my land to be sold out and the proceeds of any property sold to be the maintenance of My two Children I have one negro Child (Maticia) one Cow & half of a Plough one Trepper and half seven shillings four large One & 2 small One or White Swin & pigs one Sotly seven shillings one Calf one or half of a Cows Cask to be sold to pay my just debts I do hereby certify and approved & signed Tangham my Executor to this my last will & testament the 21st day of February 1628
