Samuel B. Sumner

I Samuel Drury son of the County of Southampton do make this my last will & testament as follows viz First I give to my daughter Anne Drury all the property in her possession which I have heretofore given her Secondly I give to my son Arthur Drury five hundred dollars and my negro man Tom to him and his heirs forever Thirdly I give to my daughter Emily Drury my negro girl Malinda and her future increase to her & her heirs forever Fourthly My wife and I agree that the remainder of my Slaves and personal Estate be Equally divided between all my Children excepting my Daughter Anne Case young or share to the share of my Son Samuel Drury dead to be Equally divided between them

My will and I agree that all my Land may be sold to the highest bidder by my executors out of the sales of which I give to my daughter Emily Drury Two hundred dollars and to my daughter or Son Samuel Drury one hundred and fifty dollars the remainder of the sales of my said Land to be divided in the same manner as is directed in the division of my personal Estate & Slaves

Lastly I do appoint ^{my sons} Arthur Drury & Jesse Drury executors to this my last will and testament shown under my hand and seal this 10th day of August in the Year 1825
