LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of Arthur Perring of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being at this time in perfect health and of perfect mind and memory and also calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and declare this as my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Molly Perring wife of Lawrence Syner one negro boy named Oscar to her and her heirs forever I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Johnson formerly Elizabeth Perring one negro girl named Alice to her and to her heirs forever I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Perring one negro girl named Mary one bed and furniture one cow and calf one horse one dog and one spinning wheel to her and to her heirs forever I give to my son Miles Perring the plantation wherein I now live containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less which land is bounded by the lines of Benjamin Biffin Selah Bradshaw Benjamin Bradshaw Joseph Bradshaw Francis Syner and Charles Syner to him and to his heirs forever also I give and bequeath unto my son Miles Perring one negro man named Lazarus & I give unto him one cow and calf one bed and furniture one dog and Lamb and I give & give to him and to his heirs forever I give and bequeath to Sally Bradshaw formerly Sally Perring one negro woman named Eliza to her and to her heirs forever I give unto my daughter Charlotte Perring the use of one negro boy named Stephen during his natural life and no longer also my will and desire is that my share in the plantation that I have given to my son Miles Perring at my death be sold for the purpose of paying a part of my debts and also all the balance of my estate of every kind whatsoever not heretofore given or sold be sold for the same purposes And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Henry Perring my whole sole executor to this my last will and testament hereby making and do annulling all other wills or wills by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have signed my hand and seal this 23rd day of November 1822

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th November 1826 John Wooten was presented in Court by Lawrence Syner the said Syner named Juror by the oath of Henry Perring & Jacob Bradshaw the witnesses hereto & ordered to be received and in the motion of the said John Wooten made according to Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining probt thereof as due from the said John Wooten & Secrecy whereupon the said Lawrence Syner with the said Syner & Francis Syner his Stewards entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of \$5000 conditioned as the Law directs

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of Charles Bailey of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do hereby make this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say First I give to my wife Rebecca Bailey during her natural life or widowhood the use of the plantation wherein I now live also my largest slave I also give to my wife Rebecca Bailey the following negroes to wit Sam Tom Franky and Clarissa and two feather Beds and furniture to her and her heirs forever Secondly I give to my son Samuel Bailey the Tract of land and plantation wherein he now lives containing by estimation three hundred and sixty eight acres to him and his heirs forever I also give to my son Samuel Bailey three negroes to wit Mary Mary and Charlotte to him and his heirs forever Thirdly I give to my son Joseph Bailey the Tract of land and plantation wherein he now lives containing by estimation 295 acres to him and his heirs forever I also give to my said son Joseph Bailey a negro boy named Calvert a negro woman Jenny and her daughter Cherry to him and his heirs forever Fourthly It is my will and desire that the following negroes to wit Daniel & Maria shall be sold by my exec for the best price that can be obtained and the money arising from the sale be equally divided between the children of my daughter Barbara Brattle Fifthly after the death or marriage of my wife Rebecca I give the plantation and Tract of land wherein I now live (whereof I have before given to my wife during her life or widowhood) to my son John Bailey to him and his heirs forever I also give to my son John Bailey
